





SRI SARADA INSTITUTIONS, TIRUNELVELI A Brief Introduction

Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam was founded by Srimat Swami Chidbhavananda in 1942 with the object of propagating moral and spiritual values and promoting education. In fulfillment of this noble goal the Tapovanam runs 9 colleges and 37 schools through its 14 branches.

Of these 14 branches of the Tapovanam, that at Tirunelveli was started in 1986 in a campus of 82 acres. The following educational institutions are functioning in the campus:

- Sri Sarada College for Women
- Sri Sarada Matriculation Higher Secondary School
- Sri Sarada Vidyalaya High School
- Sri Sarada College of Education for Women

Sri Sarada Vidyalaya High School and Sri Sarada Matriculation Higher Secondary School

Also started in 1986 along with the college, with 360 students, the schools have now on their rolls about 900 students, studying right from LKG to XII Standard. The schools are recognized by the Government of Tamil Nadu. As in the college, in the schools also value-based education, devoted not only to the acquisition of knowledge but mainly to character-formation, is imparted to the students.

Sri Sarada College of Education for Women

By the requisition of the parents our management was urged to start sri sarada college of education for women with total strength of 100 students for the sake of Hindu students during the year 2008-2009. But all the religions students are admitted in our educational institution.

Swami Chidbhavananda Memorial Poor Students' Fund

Since the scholarships provided to the students by the State Government are meagre and do not support many deserving students, the Management, under its own scheme, provides financial assistance to some economically backward but meritorious students to cover the fees payable by them. Students of both the schools and the colleges avail themselves of this financial assistance through "Swami Chidbhavananda Memorial Poor Students Fund".

Other Service Activities

Swami Chidbhavananda Centenary Memorial Health Care Centre

Started in 1998, the Centenary year of the revered Founder, the Health Care Centre offers free health care to the villagers. Students and staff of the educational institutions also make use of the medical facility available in the centre.

Dairy Farm and Agriculture

Believing in the principle of self-sufficiency, the Management has set up its own dairy for meeting the requirements of the School and College hostel students. Agricultural work is also going on and the produce, in the form of paddy, coconut and vegetables, is used mainly in the hostel. The dairy and agricultural products are also offered at concessional rates to the teaching and non-teaching staff of the schools and colleges. There is also a small bakery. It products are also offered at a concessional rate.

Expansion of Service Activities

The Yatiswaris and brahmacharinis residing in the campus go to the villages every week, creating awareness in them about health and hygiene, self-help, and values in life. They conduct Deepa Poojas for the women and teach bhajans and tell stories from Ramayana and Mahabharata to the children of these villages. The Tapovanam has started a tailoring unit for the young women of the villages and a Tuition Centre for the school-going village children. It is also felt that there is an urgent need to start a Home for the Aged.

The soul of Mother Bharat is to be found in spirituality and true spirituality lies in wiping the tears of the suffering neighbour. Sri Sarada Institutions, Tirunelveli aim at a steady devotion to the actualization of true spirituality by serving women and the poor villagers. May the Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi bless us all to work ceaselessly not only for self-realisation but also for the betterment of our brethren.

SRI RAMAKRISHNA TAPOVANAM

Our Educational Agency

Sri Sarada College for Women, Tirunelveli is a premier institution of higher education for women in the southern district of Tirunelveli in Tamil Nadu. It is one among the vast network of fifty-two educational institutions managed by Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam, Tirupparaithurai.

Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam is a monastic order devoted to spiritual, cultural and educational service of Tamil Nadu. Founded by Swami Chidbhavananda in 1942 at Tirupparaithurai near Tiruchirapalli on the southern bank of the holy river Cauvery, the Tapovanam trains men and women to lead a life of renunciation and service on the basis of the ideal set out by Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda namely, "Atmano Mokshartham, Jagat Hitaya Cha" (i.e.) "For one's own salvation and for the service of humanity". Accepting as its life-members young men and women who give up home and hearth for a life of renunciation and service, the Tapovanam initiates them into sanyasa after a period of spiritual training and engages them in service activities.

"The only service to be done for our lower classes is to give them education, to develop their lost individuality...that education by which character is formed, strength of mind is increased, the intellect is expanded and by which one can stand on one's own feet" - so goes the emphatic message of Swami Vivekananda. Hence the main field of service of the Tapovanam sanyasis is education, spiritual and secular.

Spiritual education of the people of Tamil Nadu is imparted by the sanyasins of the Tapovanam through *Antaryogam* and

celebration of Sakthi Pooja, Special Pooja, Jayanthi celebrations of Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi & Swami Vivekananda and special training programme for youth. The brainchild of the Revered Founder Swami Chidbhavananda, Antaryogam is a unique spiritual retreat programme, comprising of *bhajan, Namajapam, dhyanam,* spiritual discourse, question answer session and observance of silence. Usually of one – day duration, it is also held for 3 days, or even 2 months at a stretch.

The Tapovanam seeks to transform the youth and reorient them to the cultural and spiritual tradition of Bharat through its institutions of formal education like schools and colleges. There are ten branches of the Tapovanam managed by its sanyasins or monks and five by its sanyasinis or nuns, each branch having its own educational complex of schools and / or colleges.

Notable in this regard are the Vivekananda Vidyavanam Boys High School, Tirupparaithurai, Vivekananda Higher Secondary School for Boys and Vivekananda College for men in Tiruvedakam, Madurai, all of which are run on the ancient Gurukula pattern. In these and in all the other schools and colleges all over Tamil Nadu managed by the Tapovanam, about 50,000 students are given a man-making, characterbuilding education. They are trained to love and serve their parents, family, society and the nation and to love God. Special mention must be made of Sri Sarada Samithi in Salem, which runs Sri Sarada College of Arts and Science for Women, Sri Sarada College of Education and Sri Sarada College of Physical Education, besides two Higher Secondary Schools, two Matriculation Higher Secondary Schools, two Nursery and Primary Schools, Sri Sarada Niketan College of Science in Karur.

Publication of books of spiritual significance and a philosophical journal Dharma Chakkaram is another important service activity of the Tapovanam. About 125 books of Revered Founder Swamiji have been published in the past 50 years.

Medical service and famine or flood relief work are also carried out.

OUR FOUNDER SRIMATH SWAMI CHIDBHAVANANDA

The revered Founder of all these centres of service and spirituality was Srimat Swami Chidbhavananda (1898-1985), a spiritual stalwart who rendered spiritual service to the people of Tamil Nadu for more than six decades in the twentieth century. He was a disciple of Srimat Swami Shivananda Maharaj, a direct disciple of Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa. He was well known for his lucid exposition of the Upanishads, the Bhagavad Gita, Lalitha Sahasranamam, Tiruvachakam, the hymns of Saint Thayumanavar and the teachings of Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda. He is revered as a man of realization; as a great humanist who loved all people without discrimination of caste, creed, status or similar worldly considerations; as an educationist of vision who reintroduced the ancient educational system of Gurukulavasa, with character formation and personality development as the principal objectives; as an organizer of extra-ordinary abilities and as a strict disciplinarian. A great sanyasin of the Ramakrishna-Vivekananda tradition, Swami Chidbhavananda was a classic example of a realized soul engaged constantly in *loka-sangraha*work for the welfare of humanity. If Antaryogam is his unique contribution in the field of spiritual education, it is the 'three - H' concept or "the harmonious development of the Hand, the Heart, and the Head" in that of formal secular education.

SRI SARADA COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, TIRUNELVELI

THE HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

"Education is not the amount of information that is put into your brain and runs riot there undigested all your life. We must have lifebuilding, man-making, character-making assimilation of ideas. ... The ideal, therefore, is that we must have the whole education of our country, spiritual and secular, in our hands and it must be on national lines, through national methods as far as practical" - Swami Vivekananda.

Sri Sarada College for Women, Tirunelveli was established in the year 1986, to serve a definite purpose.

The people of Tirunelveli, especially the Hindu section thereof, approached the great sage and humanist, Swami Chidbhavananda of Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam, Tirupparaithurai, requesting him to establish a college for women in Tirunelveli which would instil strict discipline, mould unswerving character and develop unflinching devotion to god in the young women of the southern districts of Tamil Nadu, at the same time as imparting sound knowledge to them.

When the Revered Swamiji agreed, the group of enthusiastic devotees set about the task of the acquisition of land and the collection of funds. The members of the Dalavai family, wealthy land-owners of the district, gave on lease for 99 years 82.20 acres of land lying along the National Highways connecting Tirunelveli and Thuthukkudi in the Ariakulam Vilakku area. Later the Government assigned the entire land to Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam for the purpose of running the college.

Application for permission to establish a women's college in Tirunelveli in the name and style of "Sri Sarada College for Women" was forwarded to the Government of Tamil Nadu, requesting the Government to sanction grants for staff salary. But the Government sanctioned permission only on condition that no grant on any account would be given to the college at any time. There was some hesitation on the part of the authorities of the Tapovanam who wondered whether they should go on with the establishment of the college. The far-sighted Founder Swamiji had warned that an out-and-out self-financing institution would be a heavy financial commitment to sanyasis compelling them to always worry about money, and an equally cumbersome opportunity for parents and students.

However the Tirunelveli public were very anxious to have a college for women in their town, run on spiritual principles that are followed in the institutions already founded and run by Swami Chidbhavananda elsewhere in Tamil Nadu; they reiterated the difficulties they faced in getting their daughters admitted in the existing colleges in the town. Yielding to the fervent appeals of the devotees and encouraged by the assurances of possible future financial assistance by some in the powers that be, the Tapovanam went ahead with the process of the establishment of the college.

Thus Sri Sarada College, Tirunelveli has been established to fulfil two specific needs or rather a two-fold need of the public of Tirunelveli, namely to have an institution of higher education for women which will (a) give prime importance to discipline and character–building as well as excellence of academic standards and (b) offer the non-minority sections of the public a place to call their own, while excluding no one.

The purpose of education is not to thrust facts and figures into the minds of students but to make them perfect human beings. It is towards fulfilling this purpose that Swami Chidbhavananda strove throughout his life and succeeded to a great extent. It is with this vision and mission of education that Sri Sarada College for Women, Tirunelveli is managed and run by the sanyasin disciples of Swami Chidbhavananda.

Along with the college, the Tapovanam also started Sri Sarada Vidyalayam High School (Tamil Medium) and Sri Sarada Matriculation Higher Secondary School in the same campus and Sri Sarada College of Education for Women in the year 2007-2008.

OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTION

- To contribute to the society 'nirai nangaiyar' or "fully educated, perfect young generation of women, each of whom will be a Kamadhenu, the milch cow of plenty and plenitude".
- 2. To infuse spiritual, ethical and moral values in the young minds of the students of all disciplines
- 3. To accomplish the all round development of the Will, Emotion and Cognition of the students through curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the college.
- 4. To encourage and enlighten the students for excellence in higher education and research.
- 5. To reach the unreached in matters intellectual and cultural.
- 6. To instil love of the Motherland and an eager intent to invigorate her through active service.
- 7. To inculcate a sense of unity of and respect for all religions, coupled with firm adherence to one's own religion.
